Aspects of the service

Housing & Resettlement



Refugees, both individuals and families, living in Plymouth will be offered a holistic service tailored to their specific needs. This could include:

- ◆ Housing advice & support to find a suitable home
- ◆ Getting to know where services are
- ◆ Support to access health services
- ◆ Advice and support to access benefits
- ◆ Support with finding a job

Together, we will create a Personal Integration Plan and will use interpreters when needed.

Language & Learning



Clients will be offered an assessment of language and learning needs.

ESOL classes will be available with crèche facilities for clients with childcare responsibilities .

We will also aim to support clients:

- ◆ To comply with DWP requirements
- ◆ Job Interviews and application techniques
- ◆ Use Universal Job match effectively
- ◆ Skills, training & development
- ◆ Access volunteering opportunities
- ◆ Support with finding a job


Community Engagement




The service will promote integration and provide advice, guidance and training across the city.

- ◆ Supporting refugee groups and communities, whether in particular parts of the city or identified by nationality and/or faith
- ◆ Training and community support for non-refugee bodies and communities, raising awareness of refugees
- ◆ Events and activities to promote community groups made up of refugees and also the integration of refugees in the wider community.
